

Charlie Chaplin was born on April 16, 1889, in London England. His birth name was Charles Spencer Chaplin, though he had many nicknames growing up such as Charlie, Charlot and the Little Tramp. His father, Charles Chaplin and his mother, Hannah Chaplin, were inducted into music hall of fame, leading the way to his exposure even as a young boy. His first on stage moment was when he was 5 years old; he sang a song that was intended to be sung by his own mother; she had become ill at the time of the performance, so little Charlie Chaplin stood instead and performed for his mother. He came to the United States in 1910, at the age of 21. He was brought to Newyork to become a professional actor. His first movie premiered in 1914, "Making a Living" and went on to make over 35 movies total in that year alone. He had a great career and life, dying on 25, 1977, in vevey, Switzerland. He had apparently died of natural causes in his sleep from old age.
