The Bombayites' so called "houses" are actually movable shacks, built from unwanted bits of tarpaulin, time and cardboard. I wondered around the maze, meeting groups of scantily clad kids and hungry, stray dogs. Popping my inquisitive head into one of the small huts, I was totally amazed by their living conditions. Estimating about twelve or more Bombayites living in each hut, these two-storey houses are usually partitioned by rough platforms with ceilings no higher than five feet from the ground. Furthermore, 'these shacks look absolutely bare - no furniture and I deduced that the inhabitants eat and sleep on the ground.
