Varaha Mandapam lies beside the Arjuna penance and is dedicated to Lord Vishnu's varaha incarnation Mahabalipuram is well connected to other cities in India. The Chennai airport is located at 60 km from Mahabalipuram. The city is also well connected by road to Chennai, Kanchipuram and Pondicherry.
