The term weathering refers to all the ways in which rocks can be broken down. It takes place because minerals formed in a particular way (say at high temperature, in case of igneous rocks) are often unstable when exposed to various conditions. Weathering involves the interaction of lithosphere (the earth's crest) with the atmosphere and hydrosphere (air and water), depending on the climatic and environmental conditions. But all kinds of weathering ultimately produce broken minerals and rock fragments and other products of the decomposition of stones. Soil is the most obvious, and from the human point of view, the most important result of the weathering process. Soil is the weathered part of the earth's crust that is capable of sustaining plant life. The character of soil depends on the nature of rock from which it is formed. It also depends on the climate and on the relative age of the soil. Immature soil is finer than broken rock fragments. Over time, immature soil develops into mature soil, which contains humus, formed from decayed plant matter. Mature soil is darker, richer in microscopic life and more conducive to plant growth.
