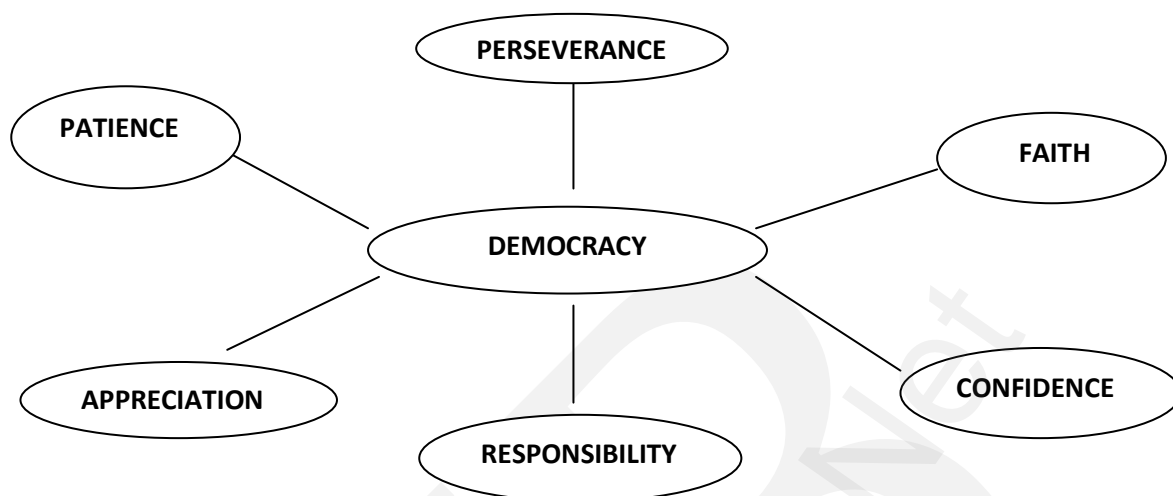

As a writer, he is best known for his keen secularism, sarcasm and love for poetry. This story gives us a real picture of human relationship in a joint family. It is a perception of Khushwant Singh of his grandmother. He describes how he had spent his childhood with his grandmother in a village. He also describes the change that came in the relationship in the city. When the author was a child, his grand mother used to wake him up in the morning and get him ready for school. She would say her morning prayer in monotonous sing song way while she bathed him and dressed him in the hope that he would listen and get to know it by heart, She would fetch his school equipments (slate, chalk, ink,etc.). She would take him to school and help him in his studies in the evening. When they settled in the city she was more concerned of his studies. When the author went to university studies and went abroad for his higher studies she accepted her seclusion with resignation. She did not show her sentiment and emotions. She was the embodiment of all good virtues and she bequeathed the same as rich legacy. Her life was a lesson for him throughout in this life. Throughout her life span she lived a modest life. She wanted that the life chain should continue along the beaten track. The elders would guide the younger generation in teaching them how to care others. They inculcate important aspects like <u>thoughtfulness, kind-heartedness , discipline, patience, ability of listening developing social skills, communication skills, companionship, gaining wisdom beyond one's age, time management ,etc.</u> to the younger generation. In these ways the elders have positive influence on younger generation.</p> <p>In this story , though the grandmother had no proper schooling and no formal education, she lived a life of Dedication and integrity. He highlights in the speech, the various qualities instilled in youngsters by the Universities, the duties and responsibilities of the graduates to the society and the importance of giving back to the society</u></p>

It was Annadurai's pleasure to deliver the convocation address. He advises the graduates to bear the layman's point of view to the findings of experts in various fields connected with education. He tells that universities are the repositories of knowledge and the nursing ground for the *emissaries of thoughts, wisdom and service*. The universities take into account the commonness, they trim and train, guide and lead them. Then they are asked to carry out their duties as the citizen of a democracy. The universities fashion out the students as an individual fitted and equipped for the task of making democracy fruitful and effective. Universities help remind the students that they are deeply indebted to the community of which they are a member. It is the community that fund for the maintenance of institutions through the states. Most of the money needed for maintaining institutions of higher education come from the revenues collected from the community through the State and a good proportion of revenue from *the tillers and the toilers* who did not enjoy this privilege. It is the bound duty of the graduates to repay what they have received. The graduate should not forget to repay his contribution to the social chest on which he had drawn so largely. The society has a right to expect an adequate return from him. This may not be in terms of money but in terms of service. For example toning up the society, in bringing light into the dark alleys, sunshine into dingy places, solace into the afflicted, hope to the despondent and a new life to every one.

“Unless service is the outcome, the sermons become sweet nothings”. As Jafferson stated, we must dream of an aristocracy of achievements arising out of democracy of opportunities.

Frederic Ogden Nash , an American poet is well known for his light verse. For his unconventional rhyming schemes and rhymlcal words he was declared the country's best known humorous poet. The poet in this poem talks about how people choose to opt for different sports in their lives or decide to become athletes. At the same time, he confesses that he is glad that he is neither a sportsman nor an athlete. But he admires the talent of all the athletes. One dislikes entering in the boxing matches but another approaches fully with heart and soul. The poet watches all these with wild excitement. The poet witnesses the athletes, their dresses, their confidence and their performances to win. He derives satisfaction by seeing them playing. He does not wish to exchange places with them. One runs long to win, another knocks out the champion down breaking his bones and spins like a horse ride whips his large horse to run fast in the lane.

"I am glad that my struggle begins
 Twix t prudence and ego, prudence wins".

Enthusiastic athletes play well to win but they cannot feel the pain of other competitors. The poet convinces that when there is a dispute between ego and prudence, prudence always wins. When there is a tough dispute the poet could hear the sudden sharp noise of the knee and cracking sound of the wrist. When the authorities call for a doctor, my unpretentious soul remains their sportiveness. Finally, the poet appreciates the sports persons for a great and grand success. He confesses that he cannot participate with any of the sports. He assures that again he will buy a ticket in the stadium and enjoy the sports as an audience and not as a sportsperson.

MACAVITY - THE MYSTERY CAT

T.S.ELIOT

T.S.Eliot was a versatile personality in the field of English Literature. He was an essayist , a critic, a publisher, a playwright and a Literary cum social critic. He was the pioneer of the 20th century . He was the most dominant figure in poetry and literary criticism in the English speaking world. He was awarded Nobel Prize for English Literature in 1948. His poem, **The Macavity – the mystery cat** is called a "**Hidden Paw**" for he is the master criminal who can defy the Law. He is the bafflement of Scotland Yard, the Flying Squard's despair. He was a trickster, plotter, and manipulator (an embodiment of all the above).

"Macavity, Macavity there's no one like Macavity,
 He's broken every human law, he breaks the law of gravity."

He could be aptly called the "Napoleon of crime" a revolting and notorious criminal. The poet brings out the efficacy of the cat in delightful and poignant imageries. Macavity is alert and agile, cunning and a master of deceit(dishonest) . Soon after a crime is reported, the Scotland Yard and the Flying squard swing into

action to detect him, but he succeeds in throwing them his trail. His lightening speed of escape frustrates the police. His eyes are deeply set with thoughtful mood. He wears as un-kempt(untidy) coat, His whiskers are not trimmed and combed. He sways his head often engrossing his criminal plans. When a crime is committed he just vanishes. He maintains innocence and decency. Macavity is known to steal food from cupboards and drink all the milk. He breaks the glass in greenhouses and tears down the trellis. Macavity is also involved in major crimes like the loss of jewellery or important government documents. He has also been accused of cheating at cards. Scotland Yard does not have his paw print in their files. So they are unable to trace him. Even if they have a few clues, they cannot accuse Macavity because he has an alibi to prove he was not there. He has been called the devil in the shape of a cat. To the anguish of the agents trailing him, he would be found to be quietly resting in a different location licking his thumbs or doing some calculations. It is evident that Macavity was a notorious criminal who could manipulate other criminals like Mungojerrie or Griddlebone. He was the remote control of countless crimes who effortlessly threw sands in the eyes of the investigators.

H.H. Munro was remembered by his pen name 'Saki'. Munro is considered a master of the short story. He used the fine narrative style. He was one of the wittiest and funniest –writers of short fiction. He pays extra money by borrowing from the Thrift and Providence Trust Corporation. Aunt Jane is totally shocked and says she can never accept their living style paying instalments. She asks them to own at least one thing in their house by giving a cheque for ten pounds To our dismay we come to know the only thing they are trying to own is their 'baby' not any other gadgets(tool). She told him that they had to pay one more installment and the baby would be really theirs. In one sense their child was not their own because they had not made full payment of Dr. Martin's bill. never becomes the owner in reality. Thus the play gives us great lessons about the negative aspects of the consumerist culture in our society.

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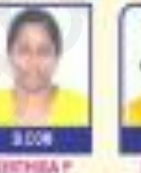
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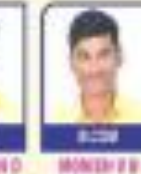
