Pi finds only limited food and water on the boat. He builds a small raft of flotation devices so that he can stay at a safe distance from the tiger. His strength of mind pushes him to live to find a way for the bad situation. Looking around he finds everything negative. But he does not lose heart. Now his main problem is to find water to quench his thirst. He is confident that if he works towards finding water he will be successful. He is moving from one end to another in the lifeboat to find out water. Atlast he sees the shining water cans. Then he realises that he has enough water for more than 100 days. At last he joins his family and the tiger goes inside a forest.
