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

Despite limited formal education, he developed a deep love for learning.Lincoln married Mary Todd in 1842. They had four sons. But only one (Robert) survived into adulthood. His family life provided after moving to Illinois, Lincoln worked as a lawyer. He served in the Illinois state legislature. His experience as a militia captain during the Black Hawk War sharpened his leadership skills.Lincoln's single term in Congress from 1847 to 1849 gave him a platform to voice his opposition to the Mexican-American War and his criticisms of President Polk's policies.Lincoln emerged as a Republican leader in the 1850s. His debates with Stephen A. Douglas and his eloquent Cooper Union speech solidified his reputation as a staunch opponent. Lincoln's election as president in 1860 triggered the secession of Southern states and the start of the Civil War. As president, he guided the country through its darkest days. He shaped the Union military strategy. Eventually, he issued the Emancipation Proclamation which declared the freedom of enslaved people in Confederate territories.Lincoln's legacy is enduring. He upheld Republican values, reunified the fractured nation and played a pivotal role in abolishing slavery. His Gettysburg Address is celebrated for its timeless call for a government "of the people, by the people, for the people." Lincoln's historical reputation continues to shine as a symbol of leadership, moral courage and the enduring pursuit of liberty and equality. His tragic assassination in 1865 cemented his place in American history. He is forever known as "The Great Emancipator" and one of the nation's most iconic statesmen.
