# NEET 2020

- ❖ NEET 2020 will be conducted by the National Testing Agency on May 3, 2020. The official notification for admissions through NEET 2020 will be released on December 2, 2019. This will be followed by the release of online application forms for the examination.

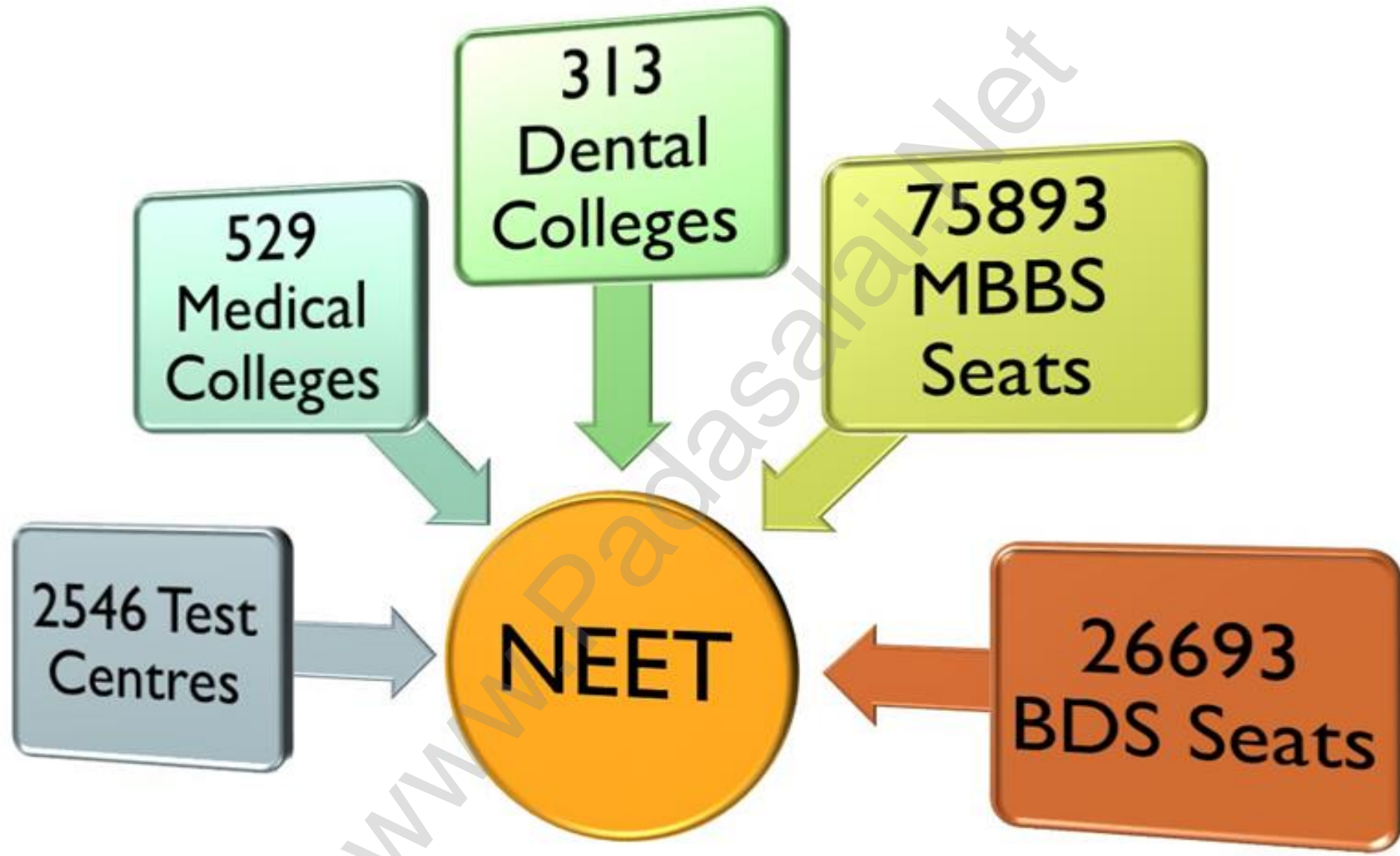
- . The last date to submit the application form will be **December 31, 2019**.
- . NEET 2020 admit card will be released on **March 27, 2020**, and will be available for download online.
- . After the examination is held, the candidate will be able to download the provisional answer key of NEET 2020 in the **last week of May 2020**.
- . The result of NEET 2020 will be announced on **June 4, 2020**, along with the final answer key.

## **What is NEET?**

The National Testing Agency conducts NEET for admission to MBBS, BDS, AYUSH, veterinary and other medical/paramedical courses in India. The National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) is conducted annually and is held across 154 test centres. With approximately 15,00,000 test-takers, NEET is the most important medical entrance examination in India.

# **NEET eligibility criteria 2020**

The National Testing Agency has prescribed the [eligibility criteria for NEET 2020](#). All those who wish to apply for the entrance test are advised to check if they fit into the criteria specified by NTA.

Candidates who fulfill the following parameters are eligible for NEET 2020:

## **Nationality:**

- Indian Nationals,
- Non-Resident Indians (NRIs)
- Overseas Citizen of India (OCI)
- Persons with Indian Origin (PIO)
- Foreign Nationals

## **Age Limit:**

- The minimum age of a candidate as on December 31, 2020, should be 17 years
- The rule specifying the maximum age limit of the candidate was scraped off last year. Thus there is no upper age limit for the candidates applying for NEET 2020.

## **Minimum qualification:**

- Candidate must have cleared Class XII or equivalent from a recognized institute
- Candidates who are appearing for Class XII or equivalent in summer 2020 can also apply for NEET 2020.
- Candidates who have completed Class XII or equivalent from an open school are also eligible

## **Mandatory subjects:**

- Candidate must have cleared Class XII or equivalent with Physics, Chemistry and Biology.
- Candidates who have passed Class XII or equivalent with Biology as an additional subject are also eligible

## **Minimum marks required in the qualifying examination:**

- . General category 50%
- . PWD category 45%
- . SC/ST/OBC 40%

# Steps to apply for NEET 2020



## NEET 2020 application fee

The application fee has to be paid online. It can be paid using a credit card/ debit card/ net banking/ e-challan/ UPI.

## **NEET question paper 2019 Physics section**

The physics section of NEET 2019 was the most difficult section. It comprised of 45 questions and was dominated by questions from mechanics. Electrodynamics, modern physics and electronics together comprised 40% of the Physics section.

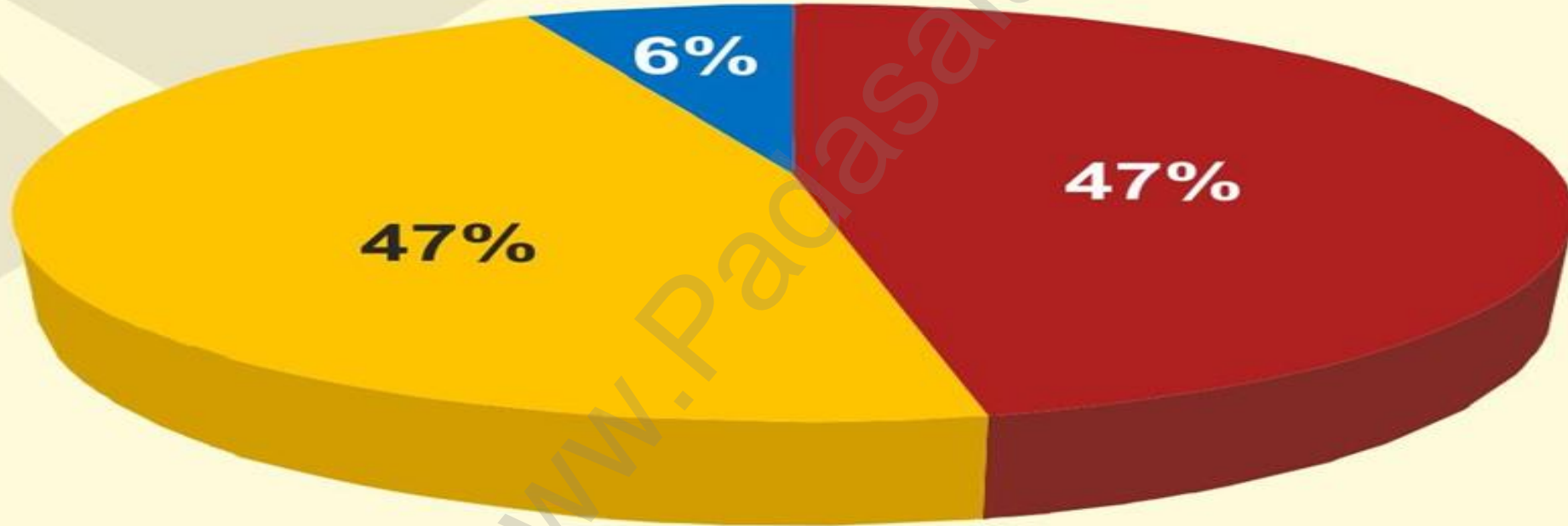

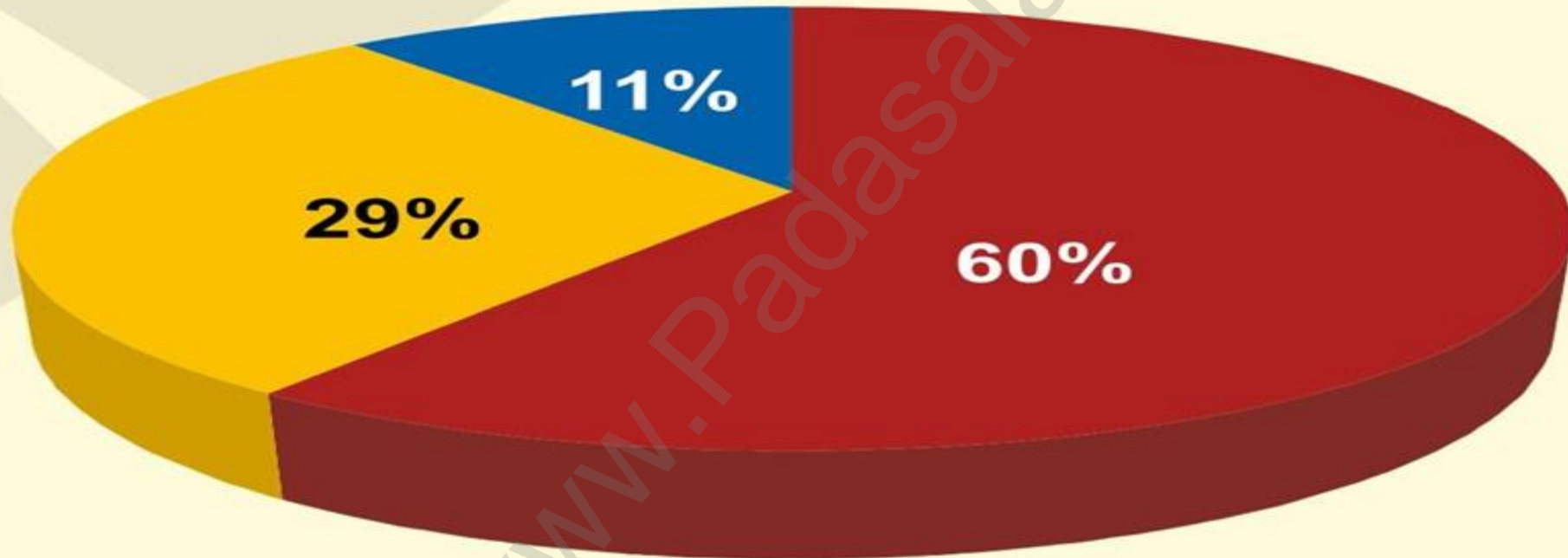

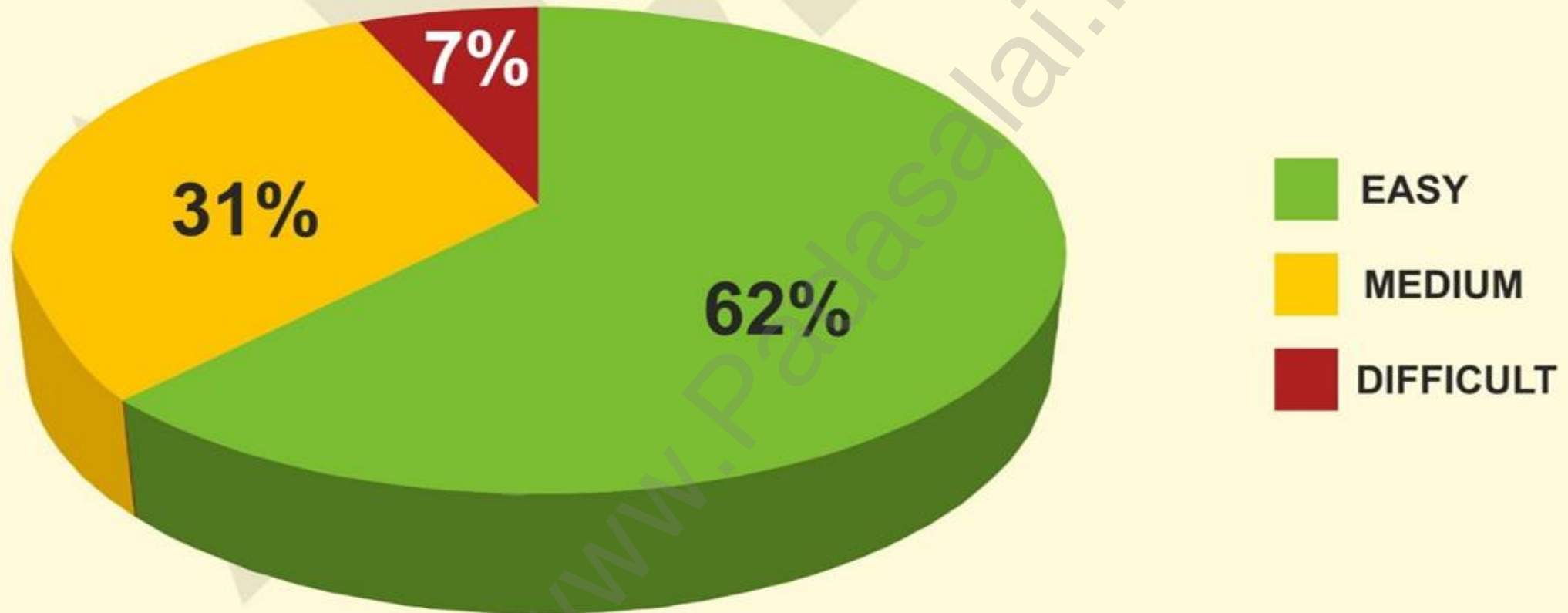
