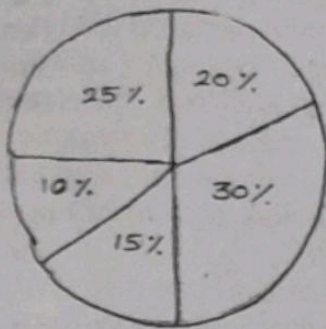

The Rome 1960 Paralympic Games was a tremendous steps in sports for athletes with physical impairment. The founder of the Paralympic movement, Sir Ludwig Guttmann and the director of the spinal centre in Rome. Antonio Maglio, started preparations for the games two years ago. It would be called the 9th Annual International Stoke Mandeville Games. Now regarded as the Rome 1960 Paralympic Games, the competition took place for six days following the closing ceremony of the XVII Olympic Committee and the Italian Institute for Disabled workers.

A total of eight different sports events, deputed at the first-ever Paralympic Games, all of which were considered beneficial and suitable for athletes with spinal cord injury;

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archery, IPC athletics dart, snooker, IPC swimming, table tennis, wheelchair basket ball and wheel chair fencing.

The opening ceremony on 18th September 1960 generated a crowd of 5000 spectators, which greeted the wheel chair athletes during their colourful entry into Acquo Acetosa Stadium. The Italian Minister for Public Health declared the games open to the world. The host Italy finished atop the medal standing followed by Great Britain, Germany, Austria and the USA. Closing ceremony was held on 25th Sep. in Palazetto Dello in the Olympic Village in the presence of Sir Guttman, the patron of games. Sir Guttman summed up the games saying; "The vast majority of competitors and escorts have fully understood the meaning of the Rome Games as a new pattern of reintegration of the paralysed into society, as well as the whole of Sport"
