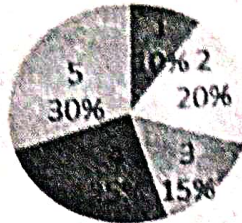

They brought figures for its fighting forces that spoke for themselves; 2,00,000 men in arms, 20,000 cavalry, 2000 chariots, and 3000 elephants.
