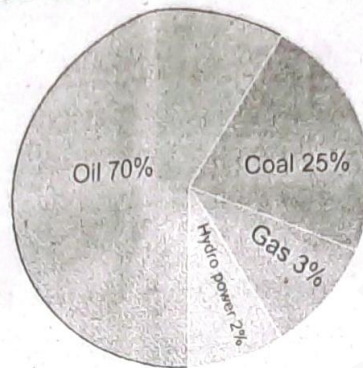

They are composed of an iron containing component called haemoglobin. When blood passes through the lungs each haemoglobin molecule picks up four oxygen molecules and supplies them to the body tissues. Red blood cells also transport the carbon dioxide from the tissues to the lungs. The lungs throw out this gas when we exhale. The white blood cells are big and few compared to the red cells, numbering only one for every 700 red cells. They are the body's defenders. The soldiers that fight bacteria and other enemies. One kind for instance, destroys dead cells. Other kinds produce antibodies against viruses. Some others consume and digest bacteria.
