Vaccines are preparations of living or killed micro-organisms or their products, used for treatment of diseases. Vaccines are of two types – live vaccines and killed vaccines. Live vaccines are prepared from living organisms. (e.g.) BCG vaccine, oral polio vaccine. Micro organism killed by heat or chemicals are called killed or inactivated vaccines. They require a primary dose followed by a subsequent booster dose; e.g. typhoid vaccine, cholera vaccine. Immunization is a process of developing resistance to infections by administration of antigens or antibodies. Inoculation of vaccines into the body to prevent diseases is called vaccination. One effective way of controlling the spread of infection is to strengthen the host defenses. This is accomplished by immunization, which is one of the most effective weapons of modern medicine. When a large proportion of a community is immunized against a disease, the rest of the people in the community are benefited because the disease does not spread. The World Health Organization, in the year 1970, has given a schedule of immunization for children. This schedule is carried out in almost all countries. BCG was prepared by two French workers Calmette and Guerin. The bacilli was weakened and used for immunization against tuberculosis. DPT is a combined vaccine for protection against Diphtheria, Pertussis and Tetanus. MMR the Mumps, Measles, Rubella vaccine offers protection against viral infections. Also, some of the micro organisms which cause diseases are beneficial to us and they are used in the preparation of curd, bread, etc. (OR)
