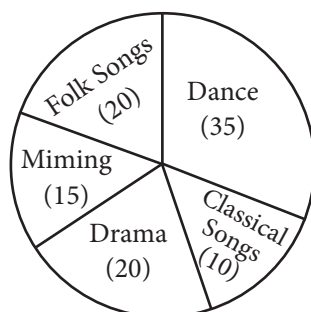

By observing the rules of the road, we can judge ourselves as civilized or uncivilized. These habits of common place intercourse make our life journey sweet or bitter.
